GLEN INNES SEVERN CONSEQUENCE MANAGEMENT GUIDE

1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This hazard/activity addressed by this guide has a risk rating of High.

Serious hazardous release in an area that causes significant damage or disruption to local infrastructure and results in road closures, limited access or egress and causes evacuations and or loss of essential services. Subsequent leak or plume may impact on the general public and the economy as well as non-contained run off into local waterways.

2. CONTROL

• The combat agency in control for this hazard is FRNSW.

3. COMMAND / CO-ORDINATION

- Local Council provide support through the LEMO to the LEOCON.
- Agencies to provide support under the coordination of the LEOCON.

4. TRIGGERS

These occurrences will trigger the activation of this guide:

- Exclusion zones that require multiple evacuation and relocation of residents and their domestic animals due to toxic plume, spillages and hazardous substance leaks and risk of explosion.
- Large evacuations due to damage to infrastructure or reduction in essential services
- Protracted closure of main arterial roads and thoroughfares.
- Multiple exposure/injuries and fatalities

Maintain public safety	FRNSW to apply Fire Brigades Act.
Ensure egress and access requirements are met through effective traffic management strategies	Police to determine and implement traffic management plan in consultation with Incident Controller RMS/Council to provide sustained traffic management including controllers and signage
Minimise effects on public health	Incident Controller to provide information on plumes and run off to LEOCON. LEOCON to implement appropriate evacuation procedures if required. FRNSW media liaison rep to provide timely updates to media outlets regarding operations. Police to advise media on fatalities
Identify secondary hazards as a result of contamination	LEOCON to ensure sitreps and Impact Assessments are received in a timely manner.
Ensure continuity of essential services	LEOCON to ensure sitreps and Impact Assessments are received in a timely manner. Facilitate restoration of essential services as soon as possible
Animal Welfare	LLS to provide support as required including relocation of domestic animals.

Public Health	NSWAS/ Health	Liaise with health facilities regarding impacts and support required. Health to provide medical advice to community in relation to incident. Ambulance Service to consider implementing associated plans.
Public Information	FRNSW/POLICE	FRNSW to provide media advice pertaining to operations to media outlets. LEOCON/FRNSW to arrange public meetings if required.
Water Supplies	Council	Council to maintain water supply to incident as required by FRNSW IC
Run off/Pollution	FRNSW/EPA/Council	FRNSW to monitor and contain/reduce run off where possible. Council to provide drainage maps and advise of areas affected by run off.
Animals	LLS	Coordinate welfare and evacuation and relocation of domestic animals and livestock. Establish holding areas and system of logging entries.
Recovery	Reconstruction Authority/LEOCON/LEMO	LEMC to establish need for a Recovery Coordinator. Reconstruction Authority to command and control recovery operations.
